Safer Door Access

What is the safer door access system?

- The system is a door-locking camera system that is being installed in all elementary schools this fall to deter intruders.
- All parents and visitors must ring the bell and provide government issued ID to enter the building.
- When you ring the safer access bell you need to state your name, your child's name, and the school you wish to visit.
- The school safety agent will check your ID, have you sign in, issue you a visitors pass, and a staff member from the school will meet you in the lobby to escort you to your destination.

Soft/Hard Lockdown -Remain Silent / Look for students in the hall /lock doors, turn off lights, put safety shade down and students should remain in their seats(for practice drills) Wait for announcement the lockdown has been lifted or all clear.

Shelter In -The threat is outside the building. First floor doors will be locked no one will be able to enter or leave the building.

Lock and Hold Hold will be initiated to manage an incident. You will lock the doors and hold all students but continue to work. They will not change periods until "All Clear" has been announced.

Allow your child to accept friend requests from strangers or any adults Allow your child to post pictures. Allow your child to disclose their/your address or current location. 	SCAN M

Children are never permitted to take cellphones into bathroom facilities. If your child chooses not to follow the cell phone policy in place at our school and engages in cyberbullying, their cell phone will be locked up during school hours. Cyberbullying

What is the definition of terms of cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying includes sending, posting, or sharing negative, harmful, false, or mean content about someone else. It can include sharing personal or private information about someone else causing embarrassment or humiliation. Some cyberbullying crosses the line into unlawful or criminal behavior.

Chancellor's Regulation A-832

STUDENT-TO-STUDENT DISCRIMINATION, HARASSMENT, INTIMIDATION AND/OR BULLYING

Adds that student-to-student discrimination, harassment, intimidation, and/or bullying are prohibited during online learning.

Adds examples to the definition of harassment and bullying. (Section I.E)

Adds texting and apps to the list of examples of modes of communicating electronically.

- Missing 10 % (or about 18 days) of school can make it harder for students to learn to read.
- By 6th grade, being chronically absent is the leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
- Half of students who miss 2-4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school.
- Attending school helps children make friends, feel good about themselves, and achieve their goals.
